2. The boundaries and areas of the state-owned Ecosystem Protection Areas will be determined by the named states with the approval of the US Forest Service. Some of these areas will be elongated greenways or irregular in shape. Part of these areas will also be used for active recreation.

3. There are nine state-owned Ecosystem Protection Areas authorized in the nine states without a National Forest large enough to qualify for this act. There are also twentyfive Ecosystem Protection Areas located on the National Forests in twenty Southern, Eastern and Mid-Western states and seventeen Ecosystem Protection Areas on the National Forests
